## 4. SECTION 4: FIRST AID MEASURES



### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

Inhalation

Remove persons affected by vapour to fresh air.  
For those providing assistance, avoid exposure to yourself or others.  
If respiratory irritation, dizziness, nausea, or unconsciousness occurs, seek immediate medical assistance.  
If breathing is irregular or has stopped, administer artificial respiration.

Skin Contact

### 4.2 Most important symptoms and effects, both acute and delayed

Burning sensation, cough, wheezing, shortness of breath, spasm. Material is extremely destructive to tissue of the mucous membranes and upper respiratory tract, eyes, and skin. Itching, pain, redness, and swelling of skin

If ingested, material may be aspirated into the lungs and cause chemical pneumonitis. Treat appropriately.
